

Coming from a single-parent family in a somewhat rural part of London, I never expected I would end up going to university, let alone studying Japanology at Hertford for five years!

It'll be two years this summer since I graduated and since then I've entered the largest insurance company in Japan to work in the sales department. Though I presumed that a decent amount of my work would use English, it turns out that all my accounts/clients are Japanese firms so my day-to-day work is done completely in Japanese (this is in fact the first time in ages that I've written English, not counting Facebook messages of course).

One of my proudest moments is when I received 97% in the Japanese Life Insurance Qualification exam. I came 12th out of 217 colleagues who took the exam that year, confusing many people, as fellow non-natives assumed I would get a near pass or fail (#proudtoprovethe wrong). Throughout my years at secondary school and sixth-form, both of which were at comprehensive schools and in Sunderland, my impression of Oxford and Cambridge universities was that they were distant, intimidating and completely unfamiliar.

The opportunity to visit Hertford, staying overnight, for an open day in September with my sixth-form made me realise that Oxford, and especially Hertford, was more inclusive than I thought. After taking a tour of the college and chatting to current students, I felt confident in applying. There were many things about the college that appealed to me. It is quite small physically but has a good number of undergraduate students, so seemed to provide the chance to meet lots of people while feeling familiar. Eva Miller (2013)

I have just completed my DPhil research on sources from the Neo-Assyrian king Ashurbanipal who ruled from 668 to 627 BCE, whose capital city of Nineveh is currently under threat from Daesh.

My research has focused on the campaign on the border of Babylonia and western Iran in 653. I use the narratives of

this one event as a means to understand the intellectual world of the Neo-Assyrian court when the Empire was at its height, and particularly how it understood violence against foreign others as a fundamental duty of the Assyrian king. The funding from the scholarship greatly aided me in my ability to devote my time to completing this year.



Kamille Adair Morgan (2014)

The legal rules governing the use of force in international relations are arguably more important today than they have ever been. My research considers whether international law permits states the right to use force extraterritorially in self-defence against terrorist and other non-state actors such as ISIS, Al-Qaeda and Boko Haram. I commenced work on this question during my MPhil, which I successfully completed in 2015. I was keen to continue on with DPhil studies in an area of law which is very current and which I am also passionate about. I am now in the final stages of my DPhil and am confident that I will complete it successfully because of the financial support I have received from the Mann Senior Scholarship in Social Sciences.


My research lies in the philosophy of physics, in particular the foundations of spacetime theories. Some examples of questions which have been occupying me since my arrival at Hertford are the following: (i) What is the relationship between general relativity and Einstein's antecedent theory of special relativity? (ii) What is the status of gravitational energy in general relativity?

Hertford has been incredibly generous in awarding me a senior scholarship – affording me the opportunity to forge fruitful collaborations and develop further my own research. The Hertford community could not have been more welcoming; it has been a pleasure to engage in stimulating high table discussions and I am extremely grateful to the alumni and friends for making this all possible.

Joe Anderson (2016)

I am currently a first year chemist at Hertford. I visited the university in September 2015 and even after a long day of meeting prospective students, Catherine (Hertford's Outreach Fellow) and her student teams were still exceptionally friendly, informative and welcoming.

On touring the college, I found it compact but bursting with character. It was this combination of people, and the college's unique, slightly architecturally muddled but characterful buildings that sealed my decision to apply to Hertford. Across the academic year 2016-17, we hosted 33 schools in college for 'Taster Days'. These days give students in Years 10-12 a flavour of what it would be like to study at Oxford, and help remove some of the stereotypes associated with Oxbridge. A number of our link schools now ensure that they arrange a visit to Hertford every year.


We maintain strong links with university-wide access programmes, and have supported Pathways, Target Schools, the UNIQ summer school*, and Into University on over 30 occasions this year. This July, we also organised a History Study Day for a group of Year 12 students from London, Essex, Medway, and beyond; the students enjoyed three academic sessions across the day and received advice about interviews and admissions tests from Hertford tutors. In total, we've worked with over 2,300 students this year, and several of our current undergraduates chose to apply to Hertford having visited the college on an outreach initiative with their schools.

Lucie Burgess (1993)

I studied nuclear and particle physics during my third year at Oxford, with my tutorial partner under the friendly and piercing blue eyes of Professor Robin Devenish. The mathematics that surrounds the impact and scattering of minute nuclear particles is complex, and I found it really challenging. I remember Professor Devenish patiently explaining neutrino scattering, which involves multiple integrations of the wave functions of the neutrinos, and suddenly everything became clear. He had a fine way of drawing diagrams which made the complex resolve to something much more simple. Oxford is full of beautiful minds and Hertford's Professor Devenish is one of them.

Michael Bentham (2014)

Research projects surrounding post-WW2 German music in Darmstadt and latterly a comparison of the operas Wozzeck and Peter Grimes are the stuff of nightmares for many. However, in Dr Benjamin Skipp, Hertford possesses a tutor with genuine enthusiasm and a commitment to assisting even the most niche research endeavours! Throughout my time at Hertford, Ben cultivated and encouraged my research interests and became a willing partner to discuss and direct my interpretations, however good or bad. His advice and support has helped me secure a place at the University of Amsterdam, studying Musicology (MA), culminating in a research thesis.

My degree has taught me to be a better thinker and it has equipped me with the necessary skills to be a social scientist. My passion to return and contribute to my home country Malaysia burned stronger than ever and I have always sought ways to apply what I have learnt at Oxford to problems back home. I am immensely grateful to the Reach Scholarship* initiative.

I'm currently in the middle of a research internship with a former central banker and financial regulator focusing on how economic research can lead to policy change. After completing the internship, I plan to pursue my goal of being an economist by working at the Malaysian central bank or the sovereign wealth fund. In the longer term, I hope to further develop my expertise by enrolling in a PhD programme so that I can better serve my country.

Richard shares his memories of tutors Roger van Noorden and Steve New.

Hertford has been transformational for me. The tutorial system, which involves building deep, personal and enduring relationships, has contributed so much to my learning, development and career. I learnt an incredible amount from Roger van Noorden and Steve New who were my tutors for Economics and Management respectively.

I remember tutorials with Roger often being early in the morning and involving him patiently asking me deep probing questions which forced me to construct logical arguments, only for him then to demolish those arguments! Steve's tutorials were at a friendlier hour of the day, but they were just as

insightful. They both took the time to help me learn not only about my subject but also how to think. Their outstanding tuition was the reason I was lucky enough to graduate with my first class honours degree and provided excellent training for the world of work.

They both took a more general interest in my life, providing wider pastoral support which was valuable given that it was the first time I had lived away from home. They continued to keep in touch with me and support me after I completed my degree. When Roger heard that I was joining Hertford's Investment Advisory Committee, he took me aside for some extra tuition to ensure that I understood how to approach investments. What an invaluable experience from the man who transformed Hertford's finances through decades of careful stewardship of the college's endowment. When I set up Richard Fidler Associates to advise innovative technology companies

Librarian, Alice Roques, who, in her time off from making my friends laugh, runs a superb academic library for the college's students and staff.


As a first-year, I remember being overwhelmed by the Bodleian's confusing network of libraries and databases, and it made a huge difference having someone knowledgeable and approachable help us navigate the phenomenal resources available. It was also a privilege to have such a well-stocked English section, which Alice frequently updates, using recommendations from students and tutors, and cross-checking reading lists with availability in other Oxford libraries.

Equally importantly in my opinion is Alice's commitment to student wellbeing: her recent innovations include the Endearment Deer – for students to leave encouraging messages during exam periods – and a new and improved study skills and self-help section.

During my final year I was a Junior Librarian at Hertford, shelving books in the evenings, and the following summer I worked as Alice's assistant. We processed countless new books, revamped the modern languages section, measured up shelf spaces in tutor's offices, and (best of all) curated a mini-exhibition of William Tyndale's works.

That summer was a fascinating confirmation of how Hertford's library functions as a focal point for the academic life of the college, as well an insight into how librarianship is changing with the increasing importance of electronic journals and databases. Following a chance to get acclimatised to both the altitude and the heat, the group headed back into the capital city with renewed focus about the two matches ahead. In both games, the college side was victorious, triumphing in two bruising, close encounters. The results levelled the 'Mongolia-Hertford series' at two a-piece with the 2013 tourists having lost both of their encounters. While in UB, the group spent a special day visiting a local underprivileged school, which the Mongolian Rugby Football Union are helping to rehabilitate through the medium of rugby, an up and coming sport in Mongolian culture. A truly memorable opportunity to continue to aid the MRFU with the local projects they diligently execute in and around Ulaanbaatar. Other significant activities included a visit to the largest equestrian statue in the world, which depicted local hero Genghis Khan valiantly riding a 40m high metal horse and a reception from the British embassy in Ulaanbaatar.
